

Resolutions for the Executive Committee.

24

1. Whereas our province is predominantly agricultural and the vast majority of Government servants have their duties cast with the agriculturists or administer departments solely entrusted with the welfare of the rural classes and whereas public employments have upto now almost entirely gone to non-agriculturists or to town-dwellers or to those who lord it over the poor peasantry and who consequently have little sympathy with the troubles of the agriculturists or cannot appreciate their needs and whereas it is the agriculturists who contribute eighty per cent of the provincial revenue, the Party is of opinion that the Government should, with due regard to efficiency, guarantee a minimum of fifty percent of Government employments to sons or dependents of the actual tillers of the soil so that the peasantry may have its due share in the administration of the province and the purpose and intentions of Government be better carried out.

2. Resolved that in the opinion of the Party the caste of a Hindu candidate should not be enquired into while seeking admission into an educational institution or public service. The only inquiry however, that may be made should be whether the candidate belongs to a scheduled caste.

3. Resolved that the Government be requested to place the debt redemption proposals before the Executive Committee before they are introduced in the Assembly in the form of a bill.

4. To discuss the rules recently framed by the Government in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2,3 and 5 of the U.P. Legislative Chambers (Members' Emoluments) Act, 1938.

Resolution.

- (a) Whereas our province is predominantly agricultural and the vast majority of Govt. servants have their duties cast with the agriculturists or administer departments solely entrusted with the welfare of the rural classes and whereas public employments have upto now almost entirely gone to non-agriculturists or to town-dwellers or to those who lord it over the poor peasantry and who consequently have little sympathy with the troubles of the agriculturists or cannot appreciate their needs and whereas it is the agriculturists who contribute eighty percent of the provincial revenue, the party is of opinion that the Govt. should, with due regard to efficiency, guarantee a minimum of fifty percent of Govt. employments to sons or dependents of the actual tillers of the soil so that the peasantry may have its due share in the administration of the province and the purpose and intentions of Govt. be better carried out.
- (b) Resolved that in the opinion of the party the caste of a Hindu candidate should not be inquired into while seeking admission into an educational institution or public service. The only inquiry, however that may be made should be whether the candidate belongs to a scheduled caste.
- (c) to discuss the rules recently framed by the Govt. in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 2, 3 and 5 of the U.P. Legislative Chambers (Members Emoluments) Act, 1938.
- (d) To discuss the matter of corruption in police ranks with special reference to Moradabad and Gonda.
- (e) To discuss the policy underlying the appointments of the Inspector General of Civil Hospitals.

" Sheo Mangal Singh

- (a) In view of the heavy pressure of work on the present Ministry it is recommended that number of Ministers be increased to nine.
- (b) On the principle that all the political posts should carry one uniform salary and with a view to enable the members of the Legislatures to devote their whole time and energy to the heavy legislative work which prevents them to attend their ~~private~~ private duties, all these posts should carry Rs 150/- as salary. It is further resolved to fix the daily allowance on the following basis:-

Members of the Legislature Rs 5/- per day, during the session of the Legislature.

The Parliamentary Secretaries Rs 5/- per day whether at Head-quarter or on tour and the Hon. Ministers Rs 15/- per day throughout the year.

The members of the Legislature, the Parliamentary Secretaries and the Hon'ble Ministers should further be entitled to a free furnished lodging. The Hon'ble Ministers and Parliamentary Secretaries should also be provided the use of a free conveyance.

It is further resolved that in case members of the Legislature absent themselves for more than three consecutive days during the session of the Legislature without adequate reasons, they will forfeit Rs 10/- per day.



The above resolution should come into force from 1st April 1939.

Resolved that strongest measures be taken to cope with communal situation in the province.

Syt. Dwarka Prasad

This meeting disapproves the action of such members of the Party as voted against the party whip in the recent elections of the Finance and the Public Health Committee and in as much as such action is subversive of all party discipline, it calls upon the Leader of the Party to take suitable steps to prevent a recrudescence of such acts.

All recruitment to the services whose monthly remuneration is above Rs 30/- all admissions to Training school and colleges and ~~the~~ to the Medical and other technical colleges be made through competitive examination for which rules may be framed.

" Chandra Bhal

- (a) Resolved that the Ministers should place before the Party a brief report of the work done during the last year and a half in each of the department under their charge. The secretary of the party should compile a report of the work of the congress party and place it before the party at an early date.
- (b) Any member of the Executive Committee absenting himself from three consecutive meetings of the committee without satisfactory explanation submitted in writing shall be deemed to have vacated his seat, which shall be filled as a casual vacancy through election by the Party. Ministers who are ex officio members of the committee shall be exempt from this rule but shall be expected to be present when questions relating to their department are on the agenda.
- (c) Resolved that the amount of punitive tax realised from Cawnpore and Benares be spent on raising, training and equipping a force of special auxiliary police instead of a punitive police force. The Executive committee considers this to be urgent and calls upon the Government to give effect to this resolution immediately.

- (a) Resolved that in as much as there is no activity of the Rural Development Department but falls within the purview of the old, well organised department and as its separate existence results merely in duplication of work and waste of money and energy, the Rural Development should be abolished outright, its staff be absorbed into the Agricultural and cooperative Deptt. and the coordination of the various rural uplift activities be secured by the establishment of a board of departmental heads under the presidentship of the Minister of Agriculture.

Resolved that in view of the time-honoured congress policy of Prohibition and of a resolution recently passed by the A.I.C.C. those members of the congress party in the Legislature who are used to drinking, if there be any such should be asked forthwith to give up the habit or else resign their seats in the Legislature.
