ASSOLUTIONS CONSIGERED الاحتاجات الله

(1) Problem of refugees and Bangla Dest:

The resolution approved by the National Executive of Bharatiya Kranti Dal was moved by Shri. Jai Ram Varma, Chairman, U.P. State BAD and a member of National Executive of BAD in the morning session of the Conference on 28.8.71 and seconded by Shri. Asrar Ahmad former Minister of State in BAD Govt. in U.P. The copies of the resolution were earlier circulated to the delegates.

Shri. Jairam Varma while moving the resolution explained in details the implications of the problem and the threat it posed to the security of the country and its economic and social life. He warned the Govt. of the Country and the people not to be



the greatest that the country or even the world had ever faced and asked the mecole to urge upon the Govt. to fird out an early solution of the same which ensured safe raturn of the refugees to their homes and their re-satilement in Bangla Desh with safety and honour.

Shri. Asrar Ahmad while seconding the resolution made it clear that never in the history of any country the Govt. resorted to such a mass killing, arson, looting, rape, destruction and torture of its defenceless people as the Govt. of Pakisten and done in Bengla Desh. He asked the people of all castes and creed to condemn the atrocities, committed by West Pakistani Military Junta, openly without any reservation and urge upon the Govt. of India to give full support in men and material to the liberation forces in Bangla Desh so that the Rie refugees return to their homes with honour in a free Bangla Desh without any fear.

About 31 delegates suggested amendments in the resolution moved and expressed their desire to speak on the subject. All of them were given opportunity to read their smendments and speak on the same except those whose amendments were unconsequential or repetitive. Prominent among those who spoke on the subject were s/Shri. Trilok Chand former idnister in U.P.;Shive Kumar Shastri, M.P./JAD; Sh.Shiv Presad Sareen, Myocate, Mathura; Ch. Guru Dutt Singh, Advocate, Mathura; Sh. 3elwan Singh, Kanpur; Sh. Abdul & jid, Devaria; Sh. Prithwi Pal Singh, Lucknow; Ch. Prestam Singh, Scharanpur; Sh. Vijai singh Rana, Agra; Sh. Ram Avadh Tripathi, Kangurigh Satya Narsin Pendey, Gorekhpur; Prof. Mahak Singh, Merut; Sh. Sri. Krishan faneja, Allahebed; 3h. Pirangi Brasad H.L.A., Gorakhour; Sh. Hira ial Drivedi, varanasi; Sh. Lexshman Swarooo, a:L. . MidRUT; Shri Jairol Singh,



Barot; Sh. dam Niwas Sharma(i.?.); Bhair v Dass(Rajasthan) etc. The speakers mainly stressed the point that the Govt. of India should accord recognisation to Bangla Desh immediately and take steps for release of Shaikh Rujibur lehman. They generally criticised the policy of Govt. of India sor for followed in this respect.

Shri. Jai Ram Varma replied to the debate and the points raised by the Speakers on the subject. All delegates withdrew their amendments except those which were accepted and the ammend/resolution was adopted unanimously as reproduced in Annexure III.

(ii) Indo-Soviet Freaty:.

The resolution approved by the National Executive of 3.0 in this connection was moved by Shri. J.L.Wahata Chairman, N.P. and a member of National Executive of BKD and seconded by Shri. Shyak Lal Yadav N.P./SKD and a member of National Executive in the evening session of the Conference on 23.3.71. The conies of the resolution were circulated to the delegates earlier.

Shri. 3.L.Mahata while moving the resolution made it clear that the freaty as its stood was more in the interest of Soviet Union that India and hence it deserved only a limited support. He further explained that the freaty in the existing circumstances was not necessary as in case of a war with Pakistan, if China came to the support of Pakistan, U.S.S.R. and U.S.A. would autimatically help India in their own interests. He added that the Treaty may preclude India from taking any unilateral action in case of Bangla Desh.

Shri. Shyam Lal Yadav while seconding the resolution laid stress on the point that the problem of Bangla Lesh was international and India should have not rushed to sign a Treaty with Soviet Union for a



periods of 20 years, only because of the threat of war bythe President of Pakistan Thri. Yahiye shan, He aread that the treaty was a security pact and it but an end to the so called non-alignment policy of the Govt. and its freedom of taking any unilateral action on Bangle Besh. He commanded the resolution moved to be unanimously adopted.

Pour delegates namely 3/3hri. Medan Lel Jain, dwalior; Balwan Singh, Ken 'ur; Kemla Kant Singh, Adamgarh, and Shri. Jagvir Singh M.L.A. Bullandsh har, suggested amendments in the resolution moved. Shri. Bikram Singi Tyagi, Ajmer, suggested out-right condemnation and rejected ion of the treaty. They all spoke on the subject and explained their point of view.

Shri. 3...Nahata replied to the debate and the points raised by the speakers. The amendments moved by first four delegates were withdrawn thereafter. The one moved by Chri. Tyagi was but to vote and was subsorted only by a few. Thus the original resolution moved was adopted by a heavy majority as reproduced in Amengure IV.

PUBLIC MARING. A public meeting was held on 28.8.71 at 6.009.M. and was addressed by Chaudhary Charan Singh, the Vational Chairman of BKO. He dealt with the various aspects of the political situation and the existing problems, the policies of Govt. of India which led to the these problems and the remedial measures therefor.
