The statement of the Chief
Minister came in a letter prepared by the State Executive

marathon session to consider
the letter from Mr Tripathi
demanding an early session of
the Assembly. Mr Charan
Singh alleged that the New
Congress leader wanted to
puil down the Government on
the floor of the House.
The statement of the Chief
Min ster came closely after a
meeting of the New Congress
Min.ster's presided over Juy.
Mr Tripathi. The meeting
asserted that there was "not
the least shift in the New
Congress stand" and that it,
was "well-nigh impossible"
to continue to support the
