Bharatiya Kranti Dal's National Executive had, on March 23 last, in National good and regardless of consequences to its own particular interests, made an appeal to all groups and parties other than Congress, which put the interest of the country above everything else, to shed their separate existences and together to form a new party, which might provide a strong, democratic alternative to Congress here and now. As a result, however, of the talks which our representatives have had with leaders of Jan Sangh, Swatantra, PSP and the others, the Executive has regretfully come to the conclusion that so far as Jan Sangh is concerned, talks with them will have to be closed. Negotiations with the other parties will continue.

At the same time, the Executive calls upon its members and all those who agree with its aims and principles and its analysis of the malaise, from which the country suffers, to go ahead with the task of organising the party with redoubled vigour, so that a network of BKD springs up all over the country and aspirations of our people for a clean and efficient administration, establishment of a society free from social, economic exploitation, and emergence of a prosperous and powerful India which will hold its head high in the comity of nations, are fulfilled as early as possible.
